

Russell Powers

You may recall an article last Autumn term, which spoke about our **Russell Powers** and the rationale for these. These are our learning powers that provide the opportunity to make the 'implicit' learning skills 'explicit' within the classroom.

In the Junior School, we have seven 'Russell Powers' that are embedded into all aspects of school life to build these vital skills from the earliest age. These are Curiosity, Creativity, Resilience, Reflectiveness, Collaboration, Initiative and Reasoning.

To make these Russell Powers as effective as possible, all colleagues have been involved in revamping them and establishing very clear and consistent use of language for learning. Each Russell Power now has clearly defined criteria, ensuring a consistent approach across all areas, which can be seen in the various accompanying shields in the images below. We continue to celebrate these Russell Powers in our weekly assemblies and have new stickers for each of these for when children return to site. Each classroom/phase will incorporate a display area to celebrate these Powers. Our tree in the central lobby area has been 'refreshed' to reflect these new Powers and definitions. We include a sneak preview in the photos below and we are excited for the children to see this for themselves when they return soon.



Music Mix


The children have had so much fun in their Music lessons across the Junior School this week.

Keli (Year 1) produced a wonderfully colourful plan of the train journey.



During Well-being Wednesday this week, the children in Year 1 listened to the story of 'The Dot' by Peter H Reynolds.


They then created their very own 'Crazy Art where the children squiggled a pattern and then filled in each section with a colourful design. We even had some parents joining in, which was lovely.



They then created individual maps and carefully positioned the different facilities, before adding a key to show where everything was.



This week in Well-being Wednesday, Year 2 enjoyed creating some 'Crazy Art'.


The children drew a large squiggle then took time to decorate it. Everyone listened to some relaxing music whilst we all doodled together.






Year 3 and 'The BFG'


In Maths, Mrs Austin set her group a challenge to send her on holiday with a healthy budget of £20,000. The group sent her to some amazing places.








In English, Year 4 have been reading 'James and the Giant Peach'. The children drew some of the characters from the book.








Year 6 Escape Room Challenge





In English, Year 6 have been working on grammar features including modal verbs, passive voice, formal language and parenthesis this week.
