This is a 24 mile run linked is to our 'Canterbury Tales' fundraising challenge. The boys and staff will run loops around school from midday on Saturday until the same time on Sunday. The aim is to run more than 133 miles, the length of the Pilgrims' Way from Winchester to Canterbury, raising money for the men's mental health charity, CALM.
