

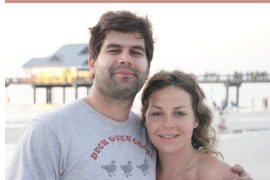
TITANIC - 100 YEARS ON



In November 2007 an Old Russellian died at the age of 96. She was Barbara Dainton (née West), the penultimate survivor of the Titanic disaster. The West girls became pupils at this all-boarders school because their father Edwy, lost on the Titanic, had been a shop floor walker for a textile department store. During WW2 1939-1945 the senior boys and senior girls switched schools. Russell Hill's proximity to Croydon Airport was considered a more dangerous target for Luftwaffe bombs. Boys, it was thought, could 'tough it out' better! In fact both schools suffered bombing but there were no casualties. Constance Miriam West, Barbara's older sister who had been aged 4 when rescued in Lifeboat 10, entered Russell Hill in 1914, staying till 1923. She returned as a teacher in the thirties and became housemistress for Norman House for 8 to 11-year olds, later after war was declared filling in for absent male teachers who had been enlisted for the Forces.
