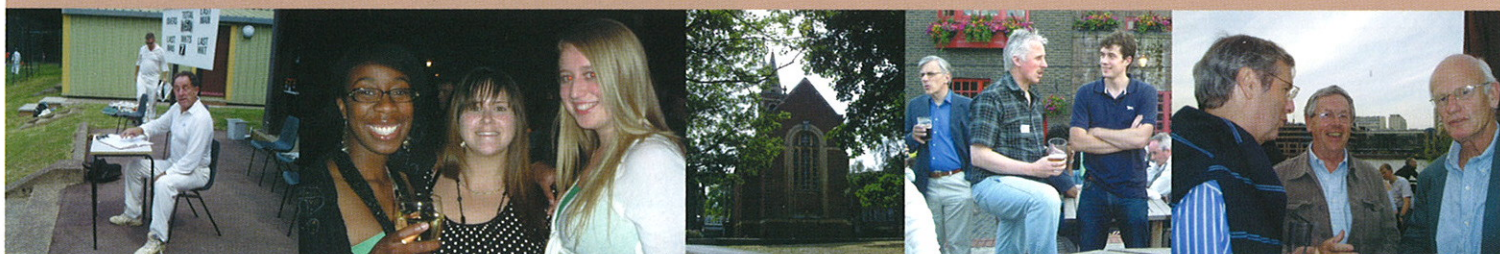

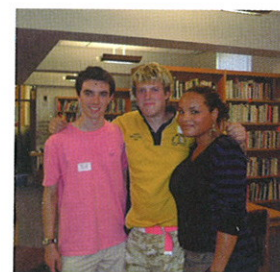
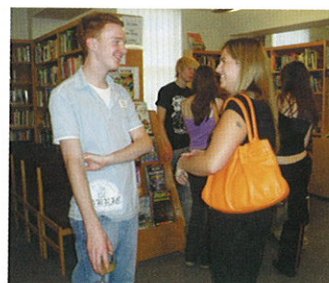

Her brother Bill was at school with Mavis and two other sisters, Edith and Doris and he has sent the 1937 group photo and identified, amazingly, 120 names. All Saints Church in East Horndon was built in 1540 but in 2006 has John Bohling (36-42) running its concerts and choir with members as young as 6. In the summer he caught "some of the tiddlers" playing games in the transept called "Killing Jesus". Peter showed extreme kindness and it was only shortly after I left that I was able to thank him personally for that and for the courtesy that he showed me throughout my time at school. For a student who had only left the school months earlier, Peter treated me as an adult, a compliment that I will never forget.

FAREWELL TO PETER MOORE AND SHAUN LIGHTMAN

Peter joined Royal Russell in September 1992 as Head of Maths and after one year was appointed Deputy Head. In the Maths Department he introduced Further Maths in the 6th Form, and made the early entry (Yr 10) Maths GCSE set a permanent feature of the school. High spots in his time at Royal Russell have included: representing the school in Australia on a short-term management exchange; leading the first school World Challenge expedition to the Amazon Basin in Guyana and guiding the school through its HMC inspection in 2004. He was particularly pleased to receive the Croydon Environmental Award for community work carried out by pupils on Saturday detentions. Sadly, though, his proposed slogan 'Come to Royal Russell, the school with the award-winning detentions' was not adopted as a marketing tool for the school!

On a personal level, his hobbies include driving fast cars and mineralogy. He has travelled worldwide to visit mines and collect mineral specimens which have been a great asset to our A level Geologists. Whilst in Guyana with the school expedition in 2000, he even managed to get the whole team into a gold mine (and collect some specimens). Peter plans to return to the South of France for his retirement; he will continue to inspect schools in the UK, and travel even more widely to collect minerals.

We are grateful to Peter for his outstanding contribution to the life of the school, and wish him the very best for the future.

Shaun arrived at Royal Russell 33 years ago. He taught PE and RE, and more recently set up and ran the highly successful Business Studies Department. One of his major contributions has been on the pastoral side where, over the years, he has been House Tutor and Housemaster of Transition House (the House for Year 7 & 8 students only), House Tutor of Oxford House, Deputy Housemaster of Crispin House, and later Housemaster of Madden House. He also helped to run many of the school regular activities.

Outside school, Shaun remained our most eminent sportsman. What a record: 1961: World Junior record holder for race walking, 1967: British 50km champion and 9th in the World Championship, 1968: 18th in the Mexico Olympics and 1970: 6th in the Commonwealth Games. In 1999 he came 4th in the world over-55s and he broke the 5,000m Polish all-comers record in 2004 for over-60s.

In retirement Shaun will be just as busy, as President of the Surrey Walking Club, and Day Chaplain at Southwark Cathedral.
