Year 2 - a window into our week!

In **English** this week we have been looking at zoo maps and how they help visitors. On Monday in small groups we created our own imaginary zoo in the school grounds and made a map to show all the different areas and animals. We then thought about what information the visitors might need and then wrote our own visitor information to accompany our maps!









In **Science**, we continued with our topic 'Plants'. This week we learned about the life cycle of a sunflower plant and we measured the seeds and bulbs that we planted last week which we recorded in our plant growth chart.





We will continue to measure them over the coming weeks then create a bar chart to record the overall data. At the end of the lesson we played some relaxing music and then pretended to be a seed, germinating then sprouting out of the ground. We then grew tall towards the sun and then once the plant died became a seed that fell back onto the earth.



In **Maths**, we have been exploring money! We have worked on recognising the value of all the coins and notes and combining these to make different amounts.

We were challenged to investigate and find as many different ways as we could make a particular amount, using a finite selection of coins. We also learnt about how to find change and practised this practically in our 'School Shop' in pairs.




The children have come up with great ideas and each week we try to complete as many as possible.


Have a look at some of the activities we have done.
