
This week's assembly reflects on some of the feedback we have seen from pupils, staff and families and is available <u>here</u>.

## Part 2

## The Second Half of Term

In this newsletter last week, and following the UK Government announcements on 10 May, I set out a plan for the possible return to some on site learning for pupils in the second half of term. A significant amount of government guidance has now been issued and the School Leadership Team are now completing a detailed Risk Assessment and operational plan on restarting our teaching provision on site. The Risk Assessment is a very important and necessary step to ensure the safety of all of our staff and pupils and to consider all aspects of the UK Government's advice for Schools regarding, cleaning, handwashing and hygiene, social distancing and managing transmission risk. Ultimately, we will publish this Risk Assessment to all members of the School Community on the School website.

The approach to a possible return to School was discussed at the Education and Welfare Committee of our Board of Governors on Wednesday this week and they are now reviewing our plans, along with the School Leadership Team, so that we are ready for the next UK Government update which we understand will be issued on Thursday 28 May.

Following this update, I will write to parents on Friday 29 May with confirmation of our plan for the delivery of Senior School teaching as we start the second half of term.

Thank you to those parents in Year 12 and in Year 10 who responded to our survey regarding a possible return to the School site for some face to face interaction with their teachers. This information will be helpful as we bring our plans together.

Whatever the announcement on Thursday 28 May, we will be continuing with our remote learning programme for all year groups in the Senior School in the first week after half-term.

We are keen to continue the review of our remote learning offer and we are using the expertise of <u>RS Academics</u> to capture feedback from parents in all year groups. We invite you to complete this survey here: Royal Russell - <u>Home Learning Survey (Parent Senior)</u>.
