

## Michael Crawford remembers...

To commemorate Battle of Britain Sunday, a memorial was unveiled for Old Russellian Arthur Dumbell Smith, a Spitfire pilot based at Kenley airfield who was shot down over Kent in the Battle of Britain and later died of his injuries.

Arthur was father to Michael Crawford, megastar of stage and screen and it was a great pleasure to meet him. The story has a special twist in that the location of Arthur's grave was unknown to Michael until he was informed by the Old Russellians. He was obviously most appreciative and willingly accepted our invitation for him to lay a wreath on the

occasion of our commemoration of the Battle of Britain weekend. We had been prompted by Michael's biography where he writes movingly of Arthur: "My mother gave me some of his books, a prized set of classics he won when he passed his exams at the Drapers' school (now Royal Russell) before the War; I still have them at home now, kept well dusted and as good as new. Those few photos, books, his service record and the 'wings' from his





uniform are all the souvenirs I'll ever have of their brief life together. Along with the stories my mother told me of their blissful relationship, I've kept the image of Smudge as heroic father figure in my mind. I've clung to that image ever since." Not only did the Royal Russell Combined Cadet

Force provide a Guard of Honour for Michael's wreath laying but he requested the chance to meet Drama and Music pupils for an instructive - and fun - Q&A session. Ophelia Humphries Elvis asked an animated Michael if he ever suffers 'stage fright!' and a bemused Michael readily admitted that he certainly did! He added for every performance of

the musical "Barnum" he had to nervously walk the tightrope across the whole stage, having first trained his nerves at the New York Circus School. He later laid his floral tributes at the nearby Kenley airfield memorial to remember their Royal Air Force crews lost in the war.
