Pupils and guests were then invited to join online sessions with Heads of Department and their pupil Academic Ambassadors, who gave personal insights into their subject experiences and UCAS aspirations.

# Russell Talks

On Thursday, the Library hosted the first Russell Talk of the new school year. At lunchtime, Sean, Wendy and Jason spoke to a full house about the differences between various disciplines of Engineering.


Jason began by summarising the speciality of Aerospace Engineering, talking about some famous Aerospace engineers including Elon Musk who is pioneering the future of space flight. The study of Aerospace engineering also encompasses subjects such as supersonic and stealth aircraft as well as reusable launch systems which are a more economical form of launch craft.

Sean then spoke about Mechanical Engineering which, perhaps, covers the broadest range of industries including marine, automotive and nuclear engineering. Sean told us about some of the early pioneers of Mechanical Engineering including George Stephenson whose inventions have led to some relatively recent innovations particularly in the rail industry.

Wendy finished off the talk with a detailed explanation of Chemical Engineering and the opportunities offered to graduates in a variety of industries including oil and gas, cosmetics and environmental control. In a nutshell, the role of Chemical Engineering is to take the smallest discoveries in the laboratory from all fields of science and provide economical and effective solutions to the world.

Wendy introduced us to some ground-breaking Chemical Engineers, including Dermot Manning who played a large part in the mass production of Polyethylene and Margaret Hutchinson Rousseau who designed the first commercial penicillin production plant.

All in all the team made a great start to the Talks series, explaining some of the complexities behind the science of Engineering and giving us plenty of food for thought.



### Football

### U14s

The game got under way with both teams really battling in wet conditions. The first effort of the game was a speculative effort from Midfielder Stefano Hadjisavvas with a great 30 yard half volley which the Hampton keeper saved.

The keeper was tested once again when full back Rhys Read-Beche had a great effort saved. Against the run of play Hampton took the lead when George Burrows gave away a penalty. The Hampton player stepped up and calmly slotted it past Laurence Friel into the bottom right corner.

However, this didn't disrupt Royal Russell as they continued to go forward and Liam Moore made a good effort after some good work from Emeka Peters. The last chance of the half fell to Emeka who had a one on one saved by their Goalkeeper. Score line was 1-0 to Hampton at half time.

Five minutes into the 2nd half and Royal Russell equalised. A great ball over the top from Lorcan Oliver who found Emeka who scored with a great finish just outside the box.

However, 2 minutes later Royal Russell took the lead. This time, Emeka was there to assist Liam Moore who smashed the ball home from the edge of the box after a slight deflection. A lack of concentration resulted in Hampton scoring a good fourth goal which then made the game extremely difficult. However, credit to Hampton who played some good football and were very clinical, resulting in a loss for the U15's.

This week on a beautiful Wednesday afternoon we travelled to Hampton for a friendly game of football. Their pitch looked immaculate. Both teams started the game passing the ball on a slick pitch without creating too much but wide players French and Kawa looking a threat.

After 20 minutes of the game starting Patrick Low had a long range effort but it was saved by their Goalkeeper.

After 35 minutes in Royal Russell took the lead with great work from David Kawa who beat his player down the byline and slid it across the 6-yard box for Joe French to finish from 3 yards. 1-0 to Royal Russell at half time.

5 mins left of the game and Hampton won a penalty when Calum Frith slid in as the ball was played behind him to take down their oncoming winger. The Hampton player stepped up and slotted it into Ethan

Endacott's left corner, although he got a hand to it but could not stop it, 2-2.

There was still time for one more goal and it was the last kick of the game and Patrick Lowe whipped an unbelievable corner and Ben Olowu towered above his defender to head home the winner and send the Royal Russell players into celebrations.

Final result was 3-2 to Royal Russsell.
